The contest is open to all students in grades K-12, private, home, and parochial schools of the Brazos Valley. The intent of the Poster/Essay Contest is:

- ◆ to provide all students in each area school with an opportunity to learn about Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr., his message and his work;
- ◆ to give students opportunity to reflect on our present and the future in light of Dr. King's message; and
- ◆ to encourage continued study through awards and recognition that can hopefully help students continue their lives and education with a permanent appreciation for Dr. King.

THEMES & CRITERIA

K - 5: "How can I create peace & unity in my community?"

K- 2: at least two complete sentences and poster entry

3-5: at least five complete sentences and poster entry

Grades 6—12 may choose a theme of their choice from the following:

***Democracy: Does it Really Work?**

***Ebonics: Does it Really Affect My Future?**

*** Write about a person you most admire or who has affected you most in life.**

6-8 grade: approximately 300-500 word essay and a poster depicting their topic

9-12 grade: approximately 500-750 word essay. Poster is optional.

Poster and essay must reference the grade level theme

K-5 Essays may be typed

6-12 Essays **must** be typed double-spaced on white, 8 ½ x 11 paper

Each page should be numbered consecutively.

Entries should be stapled securely together, not paper clipped.

For posters: use pencils, crayons, paints, markers or colored pencils. Posters should not be larger than 12" x 18". All Posters must be white.

Each entry **MUST** include a **TITLE PAGE** containing the following information:

- ◆ The Title for grade category entered
- ◆ Student Name, grade, home address and phone number
- ◆ Parent /Guardian Name & Contact Info
- ◆ Name of School and grade level. Please include teacher's name for contact if handed in by a teacher.
